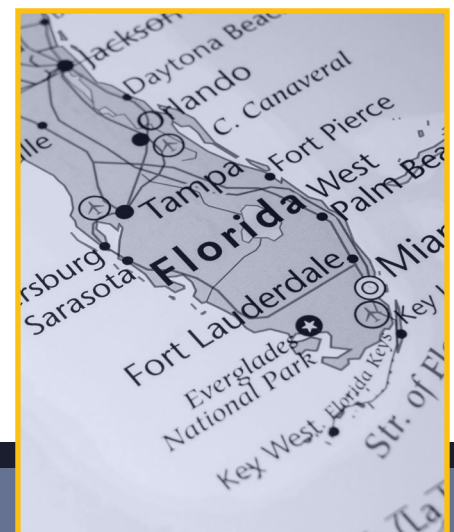

FLORIDA’S BUSINESS CLIMATE IS AT RISK

Despite its economic strengths, Florida faces structural policy failures:

- **Housing Affordability:** Teachers, nurses, and first responders are priced out of most counties.
- **Insurance Premiums:** Homeowners’ rates have surged 34% since late 2022 (source: Insurance Journal).
- **Corrections Crisis:** The Department of Corrections needs \$2.2 billion in urgent repairs (source: WUSF). Nationally, 60% of released prisoners are rearrested within three years.
- **Congested Infrastructure:** Poor transportation planning costs Florida drivers over \$1,400/year in time and repairs (source: TRIP Report).



OUR FOUR POLICY PILLARS

1. Housing Affordability

We promote zoning reform, ADU ordinances, and land-use innovations that unlock supply—without massive subsidies.
